Frequently Asked Questions



Q: When was Bethel Christian founded?

A: The school was founded in 1972.

Q: Is it a fully graded program?

A: Yes, we offer a <u>preschool</u>, an elementary school, and a college preparatory program in the high school.

Q: What curriculum does the school offer?

A: For the most part, Bethel uses <u>BJU Press</u> materials. <u>Summit Ministries</u> is used for the Worldviews course. <u>Prentice Hall</u> is used for math in grades 5-11.

O: Are the students tested?

A: Yes, all students (K5-G12) are tested annually with the Iowa Assessments. All grade levels have scored above the national average.

Q: If my child wishes to attend a state university, is the school equipped to provide that opportunity?

A: Yes, the school does provide a college directed program that satisfies the requirements for such institutions.
